WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

Let's take time to meditate on the Scriptures this week. Our theme is the healing and restoration of interpersonal relationships.

Mon. 01 October | 1 Corinthians 12:7–11 Spiritual gifts

Paul tells us that healing, like all the spiritual gifts, is given for the "common good" of the church (v. 7). The church should therefore pray for healing today.

Tues, 02 October | Mark 6:4–6 Healing and faith

The Bible teaches us that healing, like other spiritual gifts and fruitful labours, can be inhibited by our lack of faith. Believe and pray in faith for healing!

Wed. 03 October | Psalm 107:17–22 Human need and Divine intervention

Recognise the situation you are in; cry out to God and tell God what you need; accept the deliverance that God brings; and then give thanks to God.

When God gives a gift of healing, it is always intended to glorify Jesus Christ and to point us to believe in his gospel. Please, Lord, heal your people!

"Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received; freely give" (v. 8). What a mandate! God is sending you!

Sat. 06 October | 2 Chronicles 7:13–15 The ministry of reconciliation

"If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land" (v. 14). We pray that you heal our land, Lord!

Sun. 07 October | James 5:13–15 The prayer of faith

How should we pray for healing? The Bible provides a few models but no formulas. Basically we should ask God
